

Eight Players From Sens Join Hornets

Number of Regulars to Take First Drill Tomorrow—Central High to Oppose Griffs in Practice Game Tuesday—Reid, Chicago Southpaw, Joins Squad.

WITH the arrival of eight players last night from the Washington Senators' training camp at Orlando, Fla., the Charlotte Hornets' baseball squad will be virtually complete tomorrow and Manager Calvin Griffith will begin whipping his regular team into shape.

Eighteen players went through two long drills yesterday at Hayman Park in warm sunshine and the Hornet skipper reported the athletes fast rounding into shape.

Clark Griffith, president of the Senators, sent the following eight players from Sanford to report here: Henry Coppola, Early Wynn, Owen Wright and Gil Torres, pitchers; George Elliott, outfielder; George Stover, first baseman; Alfred Evans and Fermin Guerra, catchers.

These eight players have been drilling with the Senators and are in good trim and ready to swing into action with the Hornets.

Ellis Clary, star shortstop with Sanford, Fla., last season, is reported to be en route here and will likely join the squad for the Monday morning drill.

Manager Griffith announced that the Hornets will play Bob Allen's Central high school nine Tuesday afternoon in a seven-inning practice contest with both teams looking at curve ball for the first time.
