

## Nicolo Coppola, 59, Food Wholesaler, Native of Italy

Nicolo Coppola, 59, Washington wholesale food distributor, died Monday at Georgetown University Hospital. He had suffered a heart attack after a game of golf the day before.

A native of a small village near Naples, Italy, he was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Coppola, who came to this country when he was 5 years old.

Mr. Coppola was raised in East Douglas, Mass., where his father was a tailor. After graduation from high school, he

went to business school in Boston.

At the age of 20 he began his career in the food business as an accountant in the Boston offices of the Wilson Packing Co. He was transferred to Baltimore about six years later, and after a year or two there, was assigned to the meat-packing firm's office in the District.

Mr. Coppola married the former Miss Helen Bolti, a native Washingtonian, in 1926.

Prior to founding his own wholesale butter, egg and cheese distributing firm in 1940, Mr. Coppola served several years as a manager with the Southern States Marketing Co-operative. As president of Grande Valley Products, Inc., now located at 133 R street S.W., Mr. Coppola was active in many local business and civic affairs.

He was a member of the Manor Country Club, the Epicurean Club and the Southwest Lions Club. He also belonged to Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church and was a member of the Merchants and Manufacturers Association and the Greater National Capital Committee.

Besides his wife, Helen, and a daughter, Miss Dolores Coppola, both of the home address, 7217 Rollingwood drive, Chevy Chase, Md., Mr. Coppola leaves another daughter, Mrs. Lester Romine, wife of an Air Force captain stationed in Alexandria, La.

Henry P. Coppola, a brother now living in Milford, Mass., pitched for the Washington Senators baseball team in the 1935 and 1936 seasons.

In addition, Mr. Coppola leaves four other brothers, S. John Coppola of Baltimore, Capt. Joseph A. Coppola, USN, of Long Beach, Calif.; Anthony H. Coppola of East Douglas and Frank J. Coppola of 3221 Coquelin terrace, Chevy Chase; four sisters, Mrs. Anthony Colitro of Hartford, Conn.; Mrs. George Wallace of Manchester, Conn.; Mrs. Earl Shumate of Winston-Salem, N. C. and Mrs. Bernard Smyth of Worcester, Mass.; and a grandson.
